When we were attempting to conduct subgroup analysis for groups differentiated according to race/ethnicity, it became apparent that—unlike the situation in predicting deviant behavior in early adolescence—the measures of deviant behavior used for the young adult analyses formed a valid construct only for the white subjects. The measures of the construct were not sufficiently valid or reliable to permit test.

An undergraduate student sample (N=115) and a sample of college alumni (N=343) completed self-ratings on eighty-seven deviant behavior items by indicating whether they would engage in each behavior. The alumni sample completed additional ratings which rated the co-occurrence of various categories of deviant employee behavior.
