Die Freiheit wird rund um den Globus gehetzt. Asien und Afrika haben sie seit langem vertrieben. Europa betrachtet sie wie einen Fremdling, und England hat sie aufgefordert zu verschwinden. Oh, nimm den Flüchtling auf und bereite beizeiten ein Asyl für die Menschheit!“ Dieses Zitat Thomas Paines aus seiner Flugschrift „Common Sense“, die 1776 veröffentlicht wurde, ist bezeichnend für das amerikanische Bild als „[...] letztem Hort der Freiheit und als Asyl für die Menschheit [...]“. Dennoch ist gerade dieses Bild der Vereinigten Staaten von Amerika im Rahmen der Entwicklung bzw. Herausbildung einer nationalen Einwanderungspolitik mehrfach Änderungen unterworfen worden. Diese Änderungen sind insofern von äußerster Brisanz, als das sie die Einflüsse kennzeichnen, denen die Einwanderungspolitik nach der Unabhängigkeit der Vereinigten Staaten von Amerika unterworfen war. Ein wichtiger Faktor stellt hier auch die kolonial geschichtliche Entwicklung der Kolonien dar, die schließlich in die Unabhängigkeit der USA vom Mutterland England mündete und ebenfalls Einfluss auf die Entwicklung der amerikanischen Einwanderungspolitik

hatte. Diese Arbeit teilt sich in zwei Bereiche. Der erste Teil bezieht sich auf die Definition der für das Verständnis der nordamerikanischen Kolonisation und der Einwanderungspolitik wichtigsten Begriffe. Der zweite Teil soll nun aufzeigen, wie sich die Einwanderungspolitik der Vereinigten Staaten von Amerika entwickelt hat, welche Einflüsse von Kolonialzeit und dem Nativismus in der Herausbildung einer bundeseinheitlichen Einwanderungspolitik zu sehen sind, inwiefern sie bedeutsam oder weniger wichtig waren und welche Faktoren sich stringent durch den Entwicklungsprozess zogen. Inwieweit sich Kolonialzeit und Nativismus bedingten, bzw. ob überhaupt eine Verbindung besteht, darauf soll in dieser Arbeit abschließend eingegangen werden. Geburtstag *Springer-Verlag* The interrelationship of law and economics has penetrated several areas of law, including general civil law, business law as well as constitutional law. 59 renowned legal scholars and economists of 15 countries discuss current fundamental issues in law and economics as well as its future perspectives. A special focus is placed on the Europeanisation and the internationalisation of the law. The Padrone *A-R Editions, Inc.* George Whitefield Chadwick (1854–1931), a Massachusetts native identified with the so-called second "New England School" of composers, is among the most important and creative American composers in the generation that bridged the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. Trained in part in Germany, he spent much of his working life educating other musicians at the New England Conservatory of Music, which he led from 1897 until his death. Chadwick fashioned a compelling individual musical voice rooted in a Euro-American musical idiom; his orchestral and chamber music was performed with some frequency in his own day and has been revived in ours. His opera *The Padrone*, set to a libretto by David K. Stevens (based on an idea from Chadwick himself), was composed in 1912; it was strongly influenced by the "verismo" operas of the time (such as Leoncavallo's *Pagliacci* and Puccini's *Tosca*), which attempted to bring to opera the naturalism of such late nineteenth-century writers as Zola and Ibsen. *The Padrone* is set in an American city (presumably the North End of Boston) in the "present." The story, a tragic tale in two acts with an orchestral interlude, revolves around a ruthless member of the Italian community

(“the padrone”) and his exploitation of more recently arrived immigrants. Chadwick composed *The Padrone* for submission to the Metropolitan Opera Company in New York, but the opera was rejected, probably because of its gritty realism, and was never staged during Chadwick’s lifetime. (The *Padrone* exists only in manuscript form and has never been published; its only public performance so far took place in 1997.)
